Regular Monthly Meeting
October 12th, 2017 at 7:10pm

The regular monthly meeting was held on October 12th, 2017 at the Richard A. Papa Office Building, 2-4 Park St. Fonda NY 12068.

Present: Supervisor Edward Bishop, Councilmen: Matt Paton, Janet Tyler, Bill Smith and Tony Bruno. Also present, William Holvig, Supt. of Highways, Kimberly M. Sullivan, Town Clerk, Town Attorney Robert Kruger and Sole Assessor Stella Gittle.

A motion to approve the minutes of the 09/14/17 Regular Meeting was made Smith and seconded by Paton. All present voting in favor, motion carried.

Public to speak: Lucille Taylor of Getman Rd. spoke regarding the poor road conditions on a portion of Old Trail Rd. before Getman Rd. Hwy. Supt. Holvig said he would relay the information to Eric Mead, Mont. Co. DPW.

Charles Kolowski of Kupciunas Drive expressed concerns over the speed limit on Mohawk Drive. He was hit in the shoulder while walking one morning. It was explained that there has been

traffic studies by NYSDOT and speed enforcement is key for residential areas. He wanted to know who he could speak to on a higher level, Supervisor Bishop told him to attend a County meeting.

John Newell lives next to the park and also shared his concerns with speeders.

Brian Sweet, District 2 representative of Montgomery County Legislature introduced himself.

Report from the Highway Superintendent as follows:

1. The men have doing repair work in the Highway Garage; windows trimmed and garage doors repaired. They poured concrete pads for the dumpster containers.
2. They helped the county to put shoulders on county roads. Gorman Bros. did some crack filling.
3. Holvig has met with Eric Mead about raising the amount of money the town receives in the snow contract.

Stella Gittle, Sole Assessor reported that homeowners should be receiving a rebate check from NYS for the STAR program.

Resolution #54 authorizing the Supervisor, Town Board and Highway Superintendent to audit and pay bills was made by a motion from Tyler and seconded by Smith. All present voting in favor, motion passed.

In other business: Tony Bruno thanked the Highway Dept. for their work on patching the VFW's driveway.
